

# School Dinners

#### 'Roarsome' time had in Rainbows this term.

What a super half term we have had learning about the prehistoric animals that roamed the land millions of years ago. We learnt that reptiles who swam in the water like the plesiosaurus, or flew in the sky, like a pterodactyl, weren't actually dinosaurs, but are prehistoric reptiles. Every day is a school day, even for the adults in Nursery as we never knew this either!

The children have listened to and joined in with our dinosaur focus stories each week and can name common dinosaurs which is 'roarsome'. The children have explored our Dino-land tuff tray, completed dinosaur counting in the maths area and have drawn many dinosaur pictures. The children have even thought about the noises dinosaur made with stomping their feet, swishing their tails, chomping their jaws, loudly roaring and creating dinosaur dances. We can't wait to find out what our learning will be focused on next term, let's hope

it is not as busy as this term!







### Reception

The highlight of the term was undoubtedly our superhero project. Each child had the opportunity to unleash their creativity by designing and crafting their very own superhero suit. From shields inspired by St. George's Day to masks made from cards and capes repurposed from old t-shirts, our classroom has transformed into a hub of heroic imagination. Writing about superhero powers sparked the children's imaginations as they dreamed up incredible abilities and heroic deeds. From super strength to the power of flight, their ideas were as diverse and colourful as the superheroes themselves.

We were honoured to welcome real-life heroes into our classroom. From a veterinarian nurse to an army member like Mr. Hanger, and a nurse from the JR, our children had the chance to learn first-hand about the different ways people serve and care for others in our community.

The children brought their A-game to Sports Day, showing exceptional teamwork throughout the event. Whether they were racing, cheering on their teammates, or participating in various activities, every child gave it their all and made us proud. A big shout-out to all the family members who joined us for Sports Day! Your presence and encouragement meant the world to the children.

In addition to our hero-themed activities, we're proud to report that our children continue to impress us with their dedication to Phonics and Maths. Their hard work and enthusiasm for learning are evident every day, and we couldn't be prouder of their progress.







#### Year 1

Year 1 have been enjoying an Enchanted Woodland topic this term. In English we have re-written sections of the stories 'The Gruffalo' and 'The Enchanted Sceptre' and been looking at adjectives to make our writing more interesting. We enjoyed an extra day at Forest School at the start of the term and we have been finding letters from the fairy sprits around our classroom.

Our art pieces were inspired by the land artist Andy Goldsworthy and the children brought in lots of natural materials to make their own creations in their chosen groups. They showed brilliant team work and followed their plans and designs well. Despite having to be made inside due to the wind, the patterns created were lovely and the children were thrilled with them.

In Science, we have been learning about plants and we have taken advantage of the good weather recently, taking our learning outside to go on tree and flower walks around the school. The children have been drawing parts of a plant in our outside classroom and visiting our tree each month which has suddenly blossomed beautifully! Spring is most definitely here, and we are

We had a visit from Tango, an orangutan who should live in the rainforest but came to stay with us because palm oil farming is destroying their habitat. The children learnt all about palm oil and what they could do to help. They then wrote letters to Cadburys who use palm oil in their chocolate.

We then had a visit from another animal, Shelly the sea turtle who told the children all about how plastic is hurting her and her friends who live in the oceans. They used all the information they have learnt to make a leaflet about plastic and what people can do to help.

We had a glorious trip to Sutton Courtenay to look at microhabitats. The children went on a minibeast safari and pond dipping. Thank you to our year 2 parents who continue to support us with these incredible experiences for the children.


We are very excited about our new term of learning and our last term in year 2!






#### Year 3

This term, we have been focusing on Mountains and Volcanos. The children began the term by having a presentation from Miss Woodcock, where she showed them some pictures of family mountain adventures and some of the equipment they would need to climb a mountain. From there, children wrote their own mountain stories and then created their own mythical creatures that live in volcanos. In maths, we have been focusing on time, fractions and money. In science, we have been investigating rocks, including making our own fossils and sedimentary rocks out of starbursts. In geography, we have investigated how mountains and volcanos are formed, the Earth's crust and some of the world's most famous mountains.





#### Year 4

Year 4 has been a hive of activity this term in preparation for Enterprise Week. Throughout the term, the children have researched their target market, designed their own products and advertised for their stalls. In English, we have written persuasive pitches to encourage our customers to our stalls. We delivered our pitches across the school on the lead up to our selling days and certainly caught their attention with our range of exciting products. We ended the term by writing a blog about the success of the week and will share this with Year 4 parents after half term!

This week we have been blown away by the effort that the children and parents have put into their products! Thank you to our customers from across the school community, we have made a staggering \_\_\_\_\_ in profit. This has allowed for us to pay for the coach for our Bristol Aquarium Trip and allowed us to plan an additional treat for the children. A massive thank you to everyone for supporting our event, we are extremely grateful!









#### Year 5

This term Year 5 have been exploring the Solar system, learning about the movement of the planets, understanding the cycle of day and night and how time zones and seasons vary across our planet. We also learnt about other objects in space such as asteroids and meteorites, how they are formed and what happens when they impact on a planets' surface.

In English students have written a biography on Katherine Johnson, an inspirational mathematician who worked for NASA during the Apollo missions. Katherine's story was one of rejection, determination and resilience. It was wonderful to see the children retell her life story with those key messages included.

Once again the children have produced some incredible home learning, from poems, models of the Solar system, comic book writing and facts about Space. Thank you for supporting the children at home with additional opportunities to learn and express their creativity.



#### Year 6

It has been a big term in Year 6! We have tried some karate, had a virtual reality workshop and the UTC supported some children with scientific investigations involving moss. Year 6 also celebrated Eid all the way back at the start of Term 5! We have finally finished all of our assessments. Miss Rowntree and Miss de Bruyn were so proud of the knowledge and resilience that shone through all week. We celebrated by watching Aladdin and going down to the park. You can see from the photo how much fun we had! Next term we will be holding two Enterprise Days on 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> July. This will be to raise money for our Leavers activities. 












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
